Day-by-Day in Detail

Monday, October 13th - We will depart this morning and arrive in Nashville, TN by mid-afternoon. Check-in to the Gaylord Opryland Hotel and the remaining afternoon & evening are yours to explore its nine acres of airy indoor gardens & award-winning restaurants.

<u>Tuesday. October 14</u>th - Following breakfast, head to the Grand Ole Opry. On this guided tour, you'll be privy to the sights, sounds, & stories that only happen backstage - before country music magic happens onstage! After, board the General Jackson Showboat for a delicious buffet lunch & the exciting Tennessee Legends musical show. With guitars, fiddles, & voices ringing, the music and stories of some of country music's greatest legends make this a can't-miss experience. Later, you'll have free time to explore Opry Mills for shopping & dinner on your own. This evening, return to the Grand Ole Opry for their 100th Birthday Celebration & Show!

Wednesday, October 15th - After breakfast & hotel check-out, depart for Memphis. Arrive at Elvis Presley's Graceland and experience how the King of Rock'n'Roll lived as you explore on a self-guided tour. The Graceland Experience includes a Elvis Museum, his private jet & car collection, entertainment complex, shops, restaurants & much more. Your ticket also provides a meal voucher for lunch in the complex. Later this afternoon, check-in to the Peabody Memphis before walking to Charlie Vergos Rendezvous for dinner. The legendary BBQ joint has been serving Memphis for over 75 years!

<u>Thursday</u>, <u>October 16</u>th - After breakfast, arrive at Sun Studios for a guided tour. Known as "The Birthplace of Rock'n'Roll", it is the discovery location of musical legends & genres from BB King & Elvis to Johnny Cash & Jerry Lee Lewis, from Blue & Gospel to Country & Rock'n'Roll. Next, visit the Edge Motor Museum to explore the history of the American sports car. For lunch, arrive at Memphis' oldest café, Arcade Restaurant. Spend the afternoon at the Memphis Rock'n'Soul Museum, which tells Memphis' complete musical story. Offering a comprehensive experience from the rural field hollers & sharecroppers of the 1930's to Memphis' musical heyday in the 70's. Return to the hotel in time for the famous Peabody Duck March. How did the tradition of the ducks in The Peabody fountain begin? Back in the 1930s Frank Schutt, General Manager of The Peabody, and a friend, Chip Barwick, returned from a weekend hunting trip to Arkansas. The men had a little too much Tennessee sippin' whiskey, and thought it would be funny to place some of their live duck decoys (it was legal then for hunters to use live decoys) in the beautiful Peabody fountain. Three small English call ducks were selected as "guinea pigs," and the reaction was nothing short of enthusiastic. Thus began a Peabody tradition which was to become internationally famous! Dinner tonight will be on your own at the hotel or one of the many dining options along Beale Street.

<u>Friday, October 17</u>th - Following breakfast & hotel check-out, we will start on the journey home, arriving later this evening. Meal & rest stops will be made en route.
